



Study All The Bible Says On Any Given Subject.

- 1. Never form a conclusion until you examine all God says on that subject. Truth does not contradict itself.
- 2. For example:

Jno. 3:16 – Some conclude the only thing necessary to salvation is an intellectual agreement (belief) that Jesus Christ is the Son of God.

a. However, Jno. 12:42-43 illustrates believers who are lost.

b. Faith that saves is described in <u>Jms. 2:14-26</u> as an obedient faith. Without works of obedience to God's will, man will be lost, <u>Lk. 6:46; Mt. 7:21-23</u>.

Do Not Study To Justify Yourself.

- 1. Some think it is an admission of weakness to say, *"I was wrong."* Everyone should want to be right, but our motive for study should be to learn what is right and not just to prove we were never wrong!
- 2. <u>Lk. 16:15</u>—The Pharisees often questioned Jesus from this motive which caused them to pervert the truth.
- 3. <u>2 Cor. 5:7</u>—We walk by faith, not sight.




Let The Bible Mean What It Says.

- 1. God has revealed to us what we need to know and understand, <u>Eph. 3:3-5, Deut. 29:29</u>.
- 2. Some turn away from the simple truths of the Bible in search for deeper philosophies of men or for mystical ceremonies, <u>2 Cor. 11; Col. 2:6-8</u>.
- 3. False teachers often use the more difficult passages of the Bible to teach some theory, <u>2 Pet. 3:14-17</u>.

Do Not Let Prejudice Blind You.

- 1. If we "pre-judge," making a decision without fair treatment of all the evidence, we will blind ourselves to truth, <u>2 Thess. 2:10-12</u>
- 2. Some do not understand the Bible, but the fault is not God's, <u>Mt. 13:14-15</u>.



Understand Difficult Passages In The Light Of Clear Passages.

- 1. Some scriptures are more difficult, <u>2 Pet. 3:16</u>. For the mature Christian the Bible has *"meat,"* but for the new babe in Christ there is *"milk,"* <u>Heb.5:13-14</u>.
- 2. When one comes to something that seems confusing, be careful to harmonize them with other scriptures that clearly have but one meaning. Do not isolate scriptures in such a way as to form a contradiction, for God is not the author of confusion, <u>1 Cor. 14:33</u>.
- 3. The most important attitude is the willingness to study for yourself, <u>Acts 17:11</u>; Jno. 7:17; 1 Thess. 2:13

Do Not Worship The "Idols" Of The Devil.

- 1. Idol Of Personal Opinion: "I know the Bible says...but I think..."
- Those who live in the *"imagination of their own heart"* reject God, Jer.9:1ff, 13-16; Isa. 55:8-9.
- 2. Idol of Wisdom: "Dr. So and So said this...he is educated and should know."
- His worldly wisdom might have blinded him. <u>1 Cor. 1:18-31</u> 3. Idol of Ecclesiasticism: "Our church teaches…"
- The religious leaders rejected Christ. Would you have followed them? <u>1 Cor. 2:8; 2 Tim. 4:2-4; Jer. 10:23</u>.
- 4. Idol of Human Creeds: "The catechism says thus and so..."
- Doctrines of men are the source of religious division, <u>Mt. 15:7-9; Prov. 14:12</u>

Do Not Worship The "Idols" Of The Devil.

- Idol of Inherited Traditions: "My parents believed...and if it was good enough for them it is good enough for me. Rom. 14:12; Mt. 10:34ff. Paul left everything. Phil. 3:3ff
- 6. Idol of Convenience: "Believe what you want...we are all headed to the same place, <u>Mt. 7:21-23</u>.
- 7. Idol of Popularity: "The majority believe this...surely so many could not be wrong," <u>Mt. 7:13-14</u>.



Buy The Truth And Sell It Not.


- 1. Give up anything for the sake of truth, and when once you have learned and obeyed it, refuse to part with it for any price, <u>Prov. 23:23</u>.
- 2. A desire for truth above all else be rewarded, <u>Mt. 5:6; Jno. 17:17</u>.
- 3. Handle the truth with respect, reverence, and obedience, <u>Rom. 6:17-18</u>.

Do Not Presume God Will Accept Anything Else.

- 1. Presumptuous sins are those which overstep the proper bounds of God's word, taking for granted God will accept, <u>Ps. 19:13</u>.
 - a. God has always required more than "good intentions, <u>1 Sam. 15:22-23</u>
- 2. The apostles taught that whether or not we accept God's Will without alteration makes a difference to Him, <u>Gal. 1:6-8; 2 Jno. 9</u>.

Do Not Presume God Will Accept Anything Else.

- 3. Adding to or taking from God's word brings a curse, <u>Rev. 22:18-19</u>
- 4. Remember that His word is everlasting, unchangeable, and the standard by which we shall be judged, <u>1 Pet. 1:23-25; Jno. 12:48</u>



Why Don't All Obey It?

Answer:

- God has assured us that when His word is preached that it shall not return unto Him void. <u>Isa. 55:11</u>
- If it does not save all men, it is not because God does not will it so. <u>1 Tim. 2:4; 2 Pet. 3:9</u>
- > The trouble is... some will not come to God!
- John 5:39-40 "and ye will not come to me, that ye may have life."
