- 4. In this lesson try to show the depth of the valley and the magnitude of God's grace.



# A. How Dark the Valley Can Be

2 Corinthians 4:9-11 – ...persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; always carrying about in the body the dying of Jesus, that the life of Jesus also may be manifested in our body. For we who live are constantly being delivered over to death for Jesus' sake, that the life of Jesus also may be manifested in our mortal flesh...

### A. How Dark the Valley Can Be

2 Corinthians 1:8-10 – For we do not want you to be unaware, brethren, of our affliction which came to us in Asia, that we were burdened excessively, beyond our strength, so that we despaired even of life; indeed, we had the sentence of death within ourselves in order that we should not trust in ourselves, but in God who raises the dead; who delivered us from so great a peril of death, and will deliver us, He on whom we have set our hope. And He will yet deliver us....

# A. How Dark the Valley Can Be


2 Corinthians 11:23-30 — ...often in danger of death: five times I received from the Jews thirty-nine lashes. Three time I was beaten with rods, once I was stoned, three times I was shipwrecked, a night and a day I have spent in the deep... in dangers from rivers, dangers from robbers..., dangers in the city, dangers in the wilderness, ... if I have to boast, I will boast of what pertains to my weakness.

# C. Further: Grace Upon Grace

Romans 12:6-8 – And since we have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let each exercise them accordingly: if prophecy, according to the proportion of his faith; if service, in his serving; or he who teaches, in his teaching; or he who exhorts, in his exhortation; he who gives with liberality; he who leads, with diligence; he who shows mercy, with cheerfulness.

# C. Further: Grace Upon Grace

Colossians 4:6 – Let your speech always be with grace, seasoned, as it were, with salt, so that you may know how you should respond to each person.

Colossians 3:16 – Let the word of Christ richly dwell within you, with all wisdom teaching and admonishing one another with psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with thankfulness in your hearts to God.



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2 Corinthians 8:3 – For I testify that according to their ability, and beyond their ability, they gave of their own accord, begging us with much entreaty for the favor of participation in the support of the saints.

Hebrews 10:25 – Not forsaking our own assembling together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another; and all the more, as your see the day drawing near.

Ephesians 5:25-26 – Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ also loved the church and gave Himself up for her; that He might sanctify her, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word...

1 Peter 1:22 – Since you have in obedience to the truth purified your souls for a sincere love of the brethren, fervently love one another from the heart.

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
