The Price of Faithfulness Luke 14:26-33

The Price of Faithfulness

- 1. Israel and Judah had fallen into *idolatry* and *immorality*.
- a. God punished their sins with captivity (Deuteronomy 28:45-48); 2 Chronicles 36:15-21 (586 B.C.).
- b. Remnant was allowed to return in 536
 B.C. and the temple was finally restored in 516
 B.C. (Ezra 6:14-15).

The Price of Faithfulness

- 2. Ezra returned to Jerusalem about 60 years later (457 B.C.) to revive the worship and purity of the people, Ezra 7:6-10.
- a. Led by their rulers, Israel had fallen into sin by marrying pagan women, Ezra 9:1-2 (Deuteronomy 7:1-6).
- b. Ezra was dismayed at the people's sin,
 Ezra 9:3-4.

The Price of Faithfulness

3. Ezra calls on the people to repent of their sins and turn back to God (Ezra 10). From it we learn what it means to deny ourselves in order to be right with God (Luke 9:23).

I. PUTTING AWAY SIN.

- A. We can Never be Right with God when Sin is Present in our Lives, Isaiah 59:1-2; 2
 Corinthians 6:17-18.
- 1. Sin is <u>deadly</u>, **1 John 3:4; 5:17; Ephesians 2:1-3**.
- <u>Certain marriages were sinful</u> in Israel
 Ezra 9:2, 14; 10:10.

I. PUTTING AWAY SIN.

- B. Christians must Put Away Every Kind of Sin (1 Thessalonians 5:22)
- 1. The old man of sin, **Ephesians 4:22-** 24; the flesh, **Colossians 3:5-9**.
- 2. Israelites had to put away their foreign wives, **Ezra 10:3**.
- 3. Like ancient Israel, one must put away a spouse in a sinful marriage, Matthew 19:9-12 (1 Corinthians 7:10-11).

II. WHAT IT TAKES TO PUT AWAY SIN.

- A. The Sacrifice of Precious Things.
- Wives and children, Ezra 10:3, 10-11, 44.
- a. The sinful nature of these marriages did not mean there was any less pain associated with repenting of them.
- b. This keeps many from ending sinful marriages.
- 2. Jesus is our example of <u>sacrifice</u>,Philippians 2:5-8.

II. WHAT IT TAKES TO PUT AWAY SIN.

- 3. A price will be paid to be a disciple of Jesus, Luke 14:25-33.
- a. You must love Jesus more than your family. 14:26
- b. You must love Jesus more than your life. 14:26
- c. You must <u>count the cost</u> and <u>pay the</u> <u>price</u>! **14:28-33**

II. WHAT IT TAKES TO PUT AWAY SIN.

- 4. Some refuse to sacrifice for salvation,Mark 10:17-22.
- a. Some in Israel refused to pay the price, Ezra 10:15.
- b. What about us: A job? Friends and family? Acceptance?

II. WHAT IT TAKES TO PUT AWAY SIN.

- B. Self-Denial is Proof of Devotion to God,
 Galatians 2:20; Philippians 3:7-8.
- Self-denial shows we <u>love Christ</u> most, **Matthew 16:24-27**.

CONCLUSION

- I. Israel could still obtain mercy and forgiveness through repentance; and most did, Ezra 10:10-12.
- 2. Christians can repent and do the first works by putting Christ first and putting away every sin, Revelation 2:5.
- 3. Offer yourself as a living sacrifice that God accepts, Romans 12:1.
